READ WITH YOUR CHILD EVERY DAY



BUILD GOOD HABITS AT HOME: Literacy is the foundation upon which a strong education is built. Parents play a critical role at home by reading aloud to children at least once a day and having their children read aloud to them. Parents can also help their children recognize "High Frequency Words" with flashcards, in books, and in their daily environment. Identifying these words is a promotion standard, and the word lists and flashcards for each grade level can be found at HoustonISD.org/HFWE

In the classroom, guided reading, universal screening, exposure to High Frequency Words, and real-world literacy strategies aim to have every child in HISD reading and writing with fluency by the end of third grade. **HoustonISD.org/Literacy**

BE A READ HOUSTON READ VOLUNTEER: Donate an hour of time, either in person or online, each week to read to first- and second-graders to help them develop a lifelong love of reading. **HoustonISD.org/ReadHoustonRead**

STAY ON TOP OF ATTENDANCE



ABSENCES MATTER NOW: Even in elementary school, attendance is a key factor in determining your child's long-term success. Studies have linked dropout patterns with poor attendance beginning in kindergarten and shown that young students who miss too many days have trouble mastering reading. By grade 6, chronic absence is a proven warning sign that a student is at risk of dropping out.

A child is considered chronically absent after missing two or more days a month – including unexcused and excused absences. Missing more than 10 percent (or 17 days) of school a year can lead to a student not receiving a grade or being retained. It is each parent's duty to make sure his or her child attends school. Parents who do not are subject to civil prosecution by the truancy court.

KNOW THE BASICS



MEALS: All students get a free breakfast, and some campuses offer free lunch and dinner to all students. Paid lunch is \$2.25. TRANSPORTATION: Students are required to use three-point seat belts, when available, any time the bus is in motion. For information about eligibility for transportation and bus stops, contact your child's school, call **713-613-3040** or visit **HoustonISD.org/Transportation**.



METRO DISCOUNT: With the **Q Fare Card**, all students over age 6 receive a 50% discount and free transfers. Call **713-635-4000** or visit **RideMetro.org**

MEDICAL CARE: Parents or other designees will be contacted in case of illness, injury or emergency. Medications can be administered at school only with advance written parental and physician permission. For state immunization requirements, visit **HoustonISD.org/Immunizations.**

STUDENT INSURANCE: Public schools are by law not liable for injuries on campus, but parents can buy voluntary accident insurance from Texas Kids First. KEEP UP WITH ACADEMICS



REPORT CARDS: Elementary schools send report cards to parents four times during the year, shortly after the end of each **nine-week grading period**: Oct. 28, Jan. 6, March 24, and May 25. HoustonISD.org/Grading

PROMOTION STANDARDS: To move to the next grade level, students must show that they have met standards related to classroom grades, local or state tests, and attendance. **HoustonISD.org/PromotionStandards**




PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES: Conferences are designed to teach parents about classes, teacher expectations, behavior, and their child's academic progress. Conferences are typically held around report card time. Contact your child's school to schedule a conference.

GIFTED/TALENTED IDENTIFICATION: HISD serves **Gifted/Talented**, or **Vanguard**, students through either their zoned neighborhood school or a Vanguard magnet school. Vanguard identification is determined through various criteria, including an achievement test, an abilities test, grades, obstacles, and teacher recommendation or, in the case of the very young, parent recommendation. Once students are identified as G/T, they retain that designation and remain in the district's G/T program throughout their tenure in HISD, regardless of which school they attend. STAAR: State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness is the current Texas testing program for students in grades 3 through 12 that is designed to evaluate progress and ensure students are meeting grade-level expectations.
